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singer songwriters and musical open mics is an ethnographic exploration of new york city s live music events where musicians signup and perform short sets this sociological study dispels the common assumption that open mics are culturally monolithic and reserved for novice musicians open mics allow musicians at different locations within their musical development and career to interactively perform practice and network with other musicians important themes in the book include the tension between self and society in the creative process issues of creative authenticity and authorship and on going cultural changes central to the do it yourself cultural zeitgeist of the early 21st century the open mic s cultural antecedents include a radio format folk hootenannies and the jazz jam session drawing from multiple qualitative methods aldredge describes how open mics have etched a vital organizational place in the western and urban musical landscape open mics represent a creative place where the boundaries of practicing and performing seemingly blur this allows for a range of social settings from more competitive stratified and homogenous music scenes to culturally diverse weekly events often stretching late into the night

ever wondered how the open mic scene developed ever fancied starting your own open mic night are you a regular performer at open mic nights is your venue planning an open mic alec martin has been credited by some music historians as being the musician who practically invented the now flourishing open mic scene in the uk today certainly on his home patch of north west england a one time folk singer and folk club organiser alec became disgruntled with the folk music scene in the mid 1970 s and began his own folk club in his home town of bolton named cloggies partly after the bill tidy column in private eye magazine which lampooned the traditional folk music culture of the time cloggies threw down the gauntlet to other clubs in the area by adopting an anything goes policy poetry slapstick comedy magicians musicians of all genres were all welcome ten years or so later he came up with the idea of the buskers ball building on the foundation of his earlier cloggies club and from there it is possible to trace the root ideas of practically every other open mic this book charts the rise of the buskers ball which at one time was actually listed in the encyclopedia brittanica as a generic term for a meeting of acoustic musicians however it also includes a brief on starting your own own mic tips on equipment advertising etc as alec says way to do it is not set in stone but as someone who has probably been involved longer than anyone else in the country i think i ve got the hang of it by

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now the book is lavishly illustrated with photos of many of the musicians that have graced a buskers ball open mic and is an essential read for anyone that has been involved in the open mic scene or at some time in the future alec currently runs three open mics and is the presenter of anybody got a capo an internet radio show broadcast on several stations worldwide dealing exclusively with the open mic scene and featuring recorded music from his own private collection of buskers ball events and music submitted by listeners all mostly live at an open mic

open mic nights have been a mainstay in cities for decades after stumbling across one on a rainy night i found it enigmatic how during the youtube and internet age they seemed to be as popular and varied as ever this short read coffee table book offers some history and a photo essay of performers at different open mics

a light read containing monochrome imagery performance history leading to the tracking of the origins of open mic nights interspersed with old clippings and modern imagery of performers from various established manchester open mic nights

not good yet is a roller coaster ride of laughs emotional struggles and go to insightful information from an aspiring comedian who attempted the impossible to get good at comedy in just six months he gets on stage as much as possible he organizes comedy shows he checks out comedy in new york and los angeles he reads listens and breathes

all things comedy and in the end spoiler alert he fails to get consistently good but there are glimmers of hope the lessons he learns along the way will make you laugh cry and shake your head interviews with a comedy transplant an open mic veteran of nearly a decade and a comedy club owner complement his stories of accomplishment and defeat mark masters is even surer now than when he started that calling himself a comedian is a stretch in spite of that he is definitely available to perform at your showcase work event or dog s birthday party he has performed stand up comedy in six of the united states including stage time in new york city and los angeles which sounds more impressive now than it will after you read this book you can ask him anything by dropping a note at his website markmasters co like colorado where he is based

in just over a decade a tiny do it yourself stand up scene on the north side of chicago produced some of the most successful and influential stand up comedians of their generation hannibal buress t j miller kyle kinane cameron esposito pete holmes beth stelling matt braunger and kumail nanjiani make up a partial list of names of comics who emerged from a scene that had very little industry attention or even a home club it was also a scene that took a backseat to the city s vaunted improv institution and if we re being completely honest it was a scene where comics mostly performed to drunks in the backs of dingy bars on their off nights none of it was glamorous none of it should have worked at all but somehow some way the comedians from this scene have managed to etch their own names into the chicago comedy pantheon the perfect amount of wrong is the story of that scene as told by its veterans

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open mic an insight to my mind is a poetry collection that speaks not from the mind but from the heart and soul it speaks of the sweet memories we recall from our childhood the beautiful thoughts that bloom within our minds the emotional pills that are hard to swallow and the hope that in spite of everything going wrong everything will turn out okay in some aspects readers may find themselves reading upon the words they don t want to hear but perhaps need to hear which trigger foreign feelings words they wish they had heard back in the past throughout its composition open mic has delivered on giving me an insight to my mind and my biggest hope is that even just one sentence gives you an insight into yours

expressive poetry open mic series is a collection of poems that mztu recites on the open mic poems that are emotionally driven by anger anxiety and insecurities the open mic series is integrated with real relationship issues that are intimate explicit and poetic

the raucous and surprisingly poignant story of a young russia obsessed american writer and comedian who embarked on a solo tour of the former soviet republics never imagining that it would involve kidnappers garbage bags of money and encounters with the weird and wonderful from mongolia to tajikistan kazakhstan belarus and siberia are not the typical tourist destinations of a twenty something nor the places one usually goes to eat pray and or love but the mix of imperial russian opulence and soviet decay and the allure of emotionally unavailable russian men proved strangely irresistible to comedian audrey murray at age twenty eight while her friends were settling into corporate jobs and serious relationships audrey was on a one way flight to kazakhstan the first leg of a nine month solo voyage through the former user a blend of memoir and offbeat travel guide this thoughtful hilarious catalog of a young comedian s adventures is also a diary of her emotional discoveries about home love patriotism loneliness and independence sometimes surprising often disconcerting and always entertaining open mic night in moscow will inspire you to take the leap and embark on your own journey into the unknown and if you want to visit chernobyl by way of an insane asylum themed bar in kiev audrey can assure you that there s no other guidebook out there she s looked
