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these vivid portraits uncover a profound reason for the universal appeal of comedy

the first comprehensive study of its kind this book explores the contradictory connections between women and dramatic comedy women and comedy shows how a genre that has been used historically to restrict women's behavior is being reconfigured to express women's triumphs it thus redefines the assumptions with which both traditional comedy and contemporary women's plays are read and viewed challenging a critical consensus that has seen comedy as a haven for female power carlson argues that traditional comedy is deeply sexist welcoming strong women characters only because it can contain their power through an analysis of a range of comedies by shakespeare congreve maugham shaw and ayckbourn the author shows that even in these plays self consciously about liberated females women gain only a limited freedom a freedom that the endings of the plays work to negate this negotiation is seen to result in part from the comic structure itself which privileges a merely temporary inversion and an ultimate return to the status quo carlson then examines the transitional work of three writers aphra behn henry james and ann jellicoe whose heroines follow an unorthodox trajectory through their comic worlds while the work of these writers clearly remains within the mainstream comic tradition the author notes in them a subtle departure most notably in their description of the heroine as subject rather than object which prefigures the full scale transformations of women in comedy by contemporary women writers the book then examines contemporary

comedy that revises traditional comic structure at the same time as it explores fundamental social change in making her case for the difference of contemporary comedy by women carlson examines the reformulations of structure and character and considers issues of community self and sexuality in a broad range of plays by individual playwrights and by the new women s theater collectives women and comedy is an important work for students of british drama and will appeal to theater practitioners critics feminist scholars and all those interested in the performing arts

apart from the occasional recognition of comic forms or motifs in biblical dress the vast majority of interpreters have usually discounted or even disdained the possibility of the bible having any significant place for the comic vision this book attempts to make amends for this short sighted prejudicial perspective

the concept of everyday struggles can enliven our understanding of the lives of young people and how social class is made and remade this book invokes a bourdieusian spirit to think about the ways young people are pushed and pulled by the normative demands directed at them from an early age whilst they reflexively understand that allegedly available incentives for making the right choices and working hard financial and familial security social status and job satisfaction are a declining prospect in youth class and everyday struggles the figures of those classed as hipsters and bogans are used to analyse how representation works to form a symbolic and moral economy that produces and polices fuzzy class boundaries further to this the practices of young people around diy cultures are analysed to illustrate struggles to create a satisfying and meaningful existence while negotiating between study work and creative passions by thinking through different modalities of struggles which revolve around meaning making and identity creativity and authenticity threadgold brings bourdieu s sociological practice together with theories of affect emotion morals and values to broaden our understanding of how young people make choices adapt strategise succeed fail and make do youth class and everyday struggles will appeal to undergraduate and postgraduate students as well as postdoctoral researchers of fields including youth studies class and inequality work and careers subcultures media and creative industries social theory and bourdieusian theory

in this rich exciting new book gregg camfield explores nineteenth century american humor from the perspective of gender and domestic ideology challenging recent theory asserting a broad gulf between men s and women s humor during the period and contributing vital new insights to the study of humor in general capturing in part i a vision of humor unique to the era camfield examines the period s faith in what was called amiable humor a genial and supple comic mode whose non aggression makes it resist easy assimilation to theories stressing humor s basis in hostility negation rage and other combative or displaced energies seeking to illuminate this distinct comedy camfield probes a related central cultural strand the domesticity ideal that so often is a subject of this humor carefully tracking contact between the two discourses and identifying their common social and intellectual roots turning next to four literary case studies powerfully revealing of this contact camfield in part ii pairs male and female humorists washington irving and fanny fern harriet beecher stowe and herman melville mark twain and marietta holley and george washington harris and mary wilkins freeman not only to demonstrate the way these influential writers approach domesticity with genial humor but also to support his claim that gender difference does not always correlate to differences in viewpoint and practice within this common style where many argue nineteenth century women s humor constitutes a genre unto itself camfield finds that like women men filtered reaction to the constraints and opportunities of home life through genial comedy and that women like their male counterparts wrote humor marked by extravagance expansion caricature fantasy and posturing broadening out to an intriguing consideration of humor theory in part iii camfield draws on recent work in psychology culture studies neo pragmatist philosophy and neuroscience to model a compelling alternative view of humor capable of negotiating both the complexities of nineteenth century american humor and the comic art of periods before and since students and scholars of humor nineteenth century american literature and culture and women s writing will find necessary madness to be a provocative essential achievement

jokes puns stories tales sketches and shticks saturate our culture and today the stuff of comedy is almost inescapable with all comedy cable channels and stand up comics acting as a kind of electronic oracle we re laughing more often but what are we laughing at murray davis knows in this inventive book he uses jokes good bad offensive and classic to reveal the truths that comedians deliver what s so funny is not about the psychology of humor but about the objects of our laughter the world that comics turn upside down and inside out it also explores the logic of comedy as a serious critical assault on just about everything we take for granted drawing on a vast array of jokes and the work of dozens of comedians from jay leno and lenny bruce to steve allen and billy crystal davis reminds us of the extraordinarily subversive power of comedy when we laugh we accept the truth of the comic moment that this is the way life really is the book is in two parts in the first davis

explores the cultural conventions that even simple jokes take apart the rules of logic language rationality and meaning in the second he looks at the social systems that have been at the root of jokes for centuries authority figures power relations and institutions whatever their style comedians use the tools of the trade ambiguous meanings missed signals incongruous characters unlikely events to violate our expectations about the world setting comedy within a rich intellectual tradition from plato to freud hobbes to kant in philosophy as well as sociology davis makes a convincing case for comedy as a subtle complex and articulated theory of culture and society he reveals the unsuspected ways in which comedy with its spotlight on the gap between appearance and reality the ideal and the actual can be a powerful mode for understanding the world we have made

drawn from papers given at an international symposium on northrop frye in hob hot inner mongolia this volume offers insights into frye's theoretical approaches and the new context provided by cross cultural questions

this is a comprehensive 1997 account of the history of literary criticism in britain and europe between 1660 and 1800 unlike previous histories it is not just a chronological survey of critical writing but a multidisciplinary investigation of how the understanding of literature and its various genres was transformed at the start of the modern era by developments in philosophy psychology the natural sciences linguistics and other disciplines as well as in society at large in the process modern literary theory at first often implicit in literary texts themselves emancipated itself from classical poetics and rhetoric and literary criticism emerged as a full time professional activity catering for an expanding literate public the volume is international both in coverage and in authorship extensive bibliographies provide guidance for further specialised study

laughter is the best medicine how standup comedy saved my life is a captivating memoir that takes the reader on a humorous and inspiring journey through the life of a comedian the book is written by jay reid a talented stand up comedian who has performed across the country in comedy clubs theaters and on television reid's memoir is a deeply personal account of his life from his childhood in las vegas to his struggles with addiction and his eventual triumph as a successful comedian reid takes the reader on a journey through the highs and lows of his life sharing his experiences and the lessons he has learned along the way the book opens with reid's early years where he describes growing up in a tight knit family in las vegas despite being raised in a supportive environment reid's childhood was not without its challenges he struggled with depression and often felt like an outsider at school however it was during this time that reid discovered his love for comedy and he started performing stand up routines for his friends and family as reid grows older he begins to face more significant challenges he shares his struggles with addiction to marijuana and alcohol and the impact they had on his life reid writes candidly about his journey to recovery including his decision to change his diet get into fitness and use meditation to help control his desires the memoir takes a dramatic turn when reid's father passes away on the same day he was shooting the first round of the comedy contest who's got jokes despite the emotional turmoil reid decides to go ahead with the competition and his determination pays off when he is crowned the winner the book is not all about the challenges that reid has faced it also showcases the power of laughter and how it can bring joy and healing to people's lives reid shares several funny stories from his time as a bellman in las vegas where he made great money on checks and tips every day he also talks about how his children jordan and jada have helped him grow as a person and become a better father throughout the book reid's writing is raw and honest he shares his experiences with humor and humility and his storytelling skills are exceptional his words will make you laugh cry and feel inspired all at once laughter is the best medicine how standup comedy saved my life is a book for anyone who has faced adversity in their life and wants to be inspired by someone who has overcome it reid's memoir is a testament to the power of perseverance self discovery and the healing power of laughter it is a must read for anyone who loves a good laugh and a good story

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
